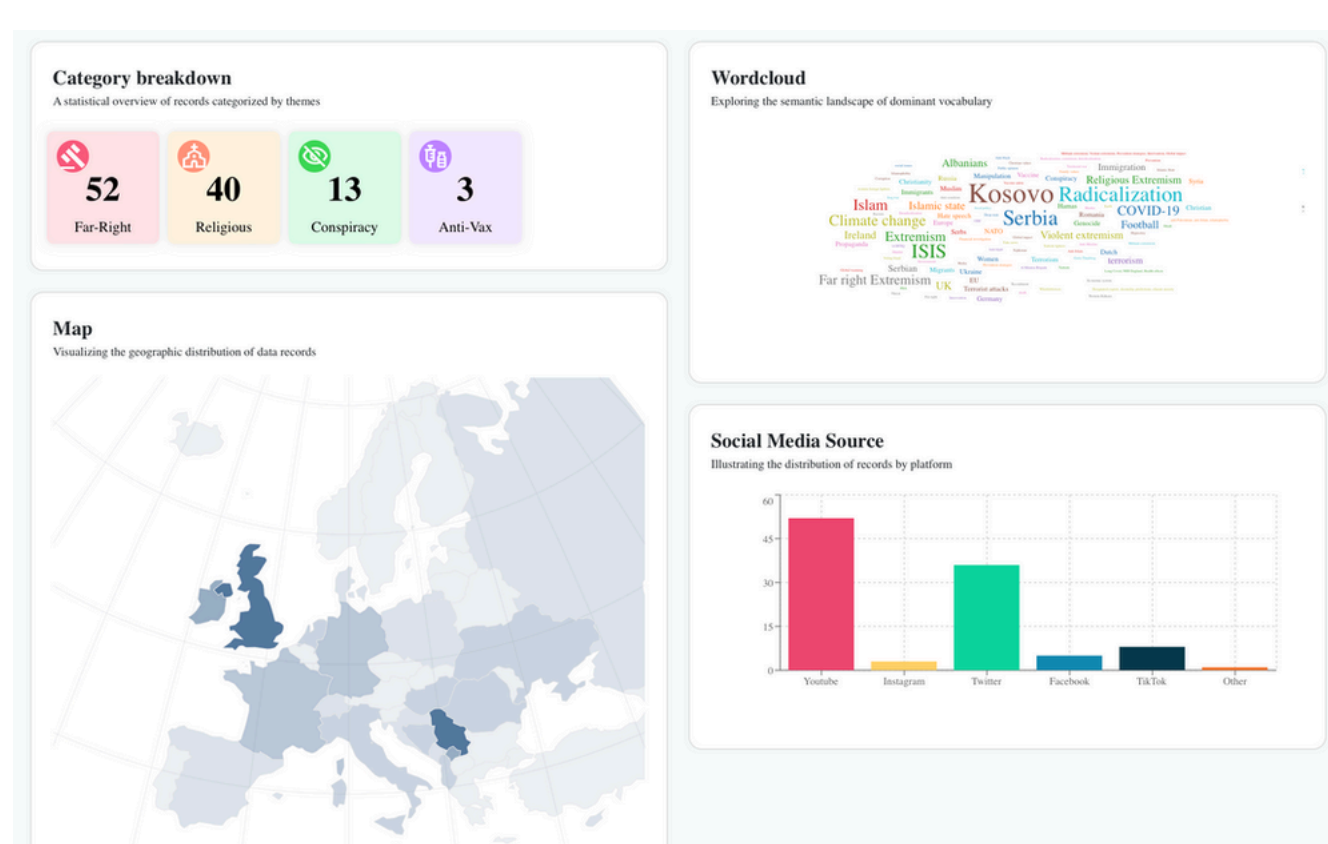


## Smidge Newsletter

We are pleased to share the latest updates on the SMIDGE Project, which tackles online extremist narratives targeting middle-aged individuals across Europe.



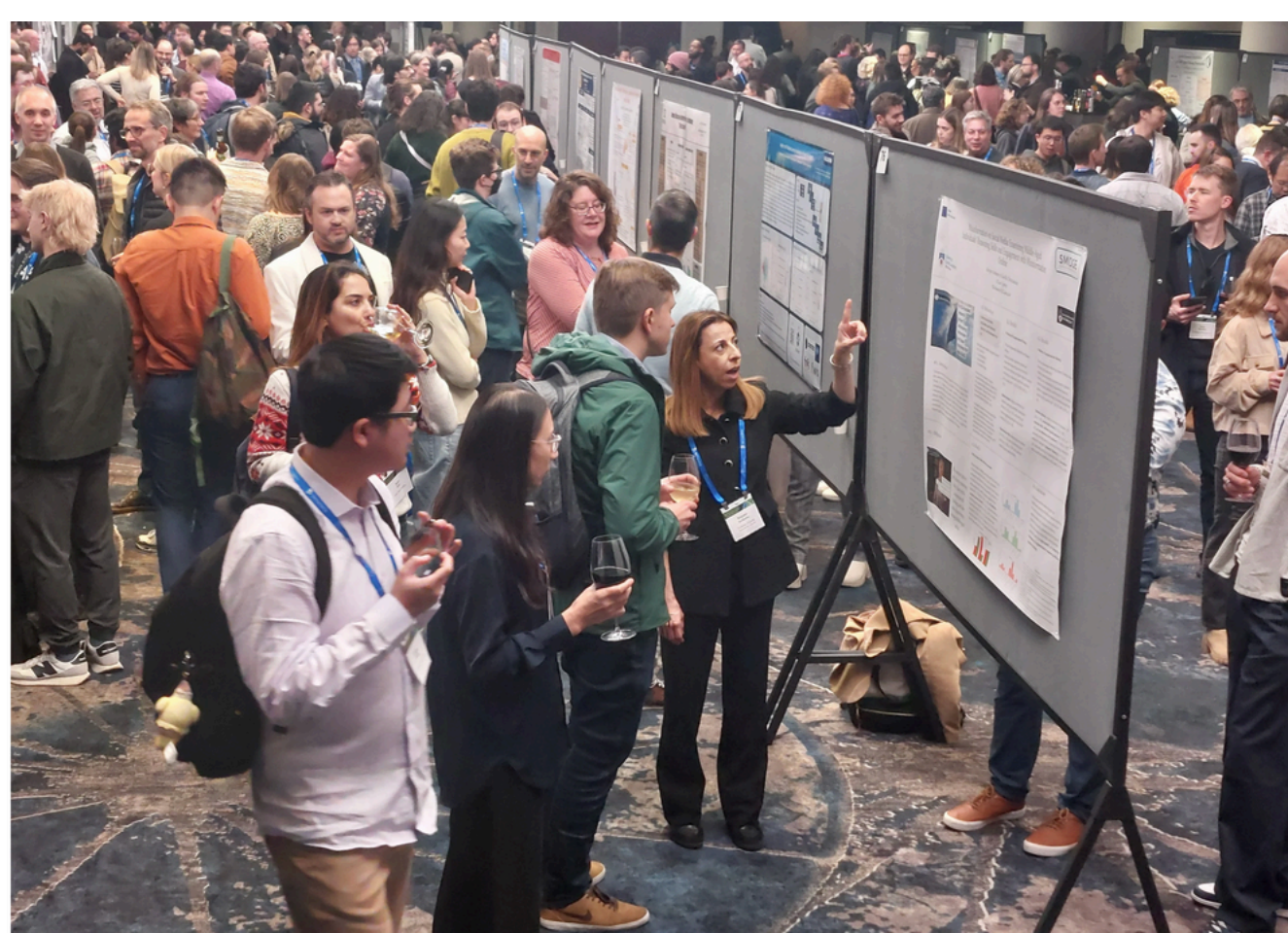
### Milestones

The SMIDGE Project proudly introduces its new [database platform](#), an essential tool for researchers and policymakers dedicated to tackling online extremism.

The database provides an in-depth look at extremist narratives circulating on major social media platforms, including YouTube, Facebook, Instagram, TikTok and Twitter. It categorises video content promoting far-right, religious, anti-vax, and conspiracy narratives—ranging from militant messaging to misinformation. Users can access data essential for evidence-based policy development and enhanced understanding of digital extremism trends.

Additionally, researchers can report extremist content, further expanding this valuable resource for real-time insights.

We are in the process of developing alternative counter-narrative materials, including MOOC content, a documentary, and micro-content (memes, images, GIFs, and videos) designed to engage middle-aged audiences, foster critical thinking, and mitigate the spread of extremist ideologies.



### Recent Activities: Events and Engagements

In an [article](#) published by The Guardian titled "Fears for UK boomer radicalisation on Facebook after Meta drops factcheckers", the Smidge Project was recognised as a pioneering initiative addressing the pressing issue of extremism among middle-aged social media users.

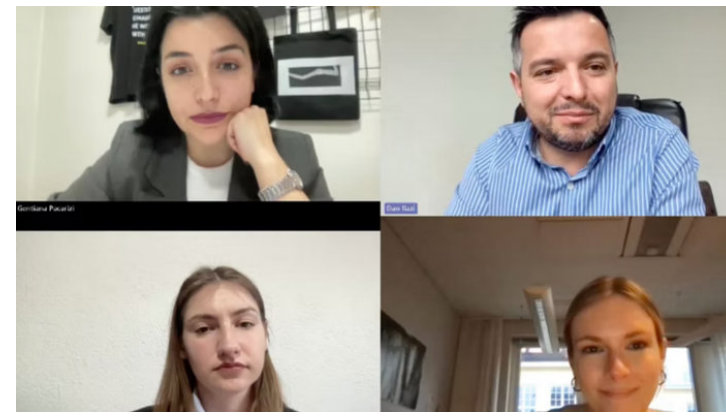

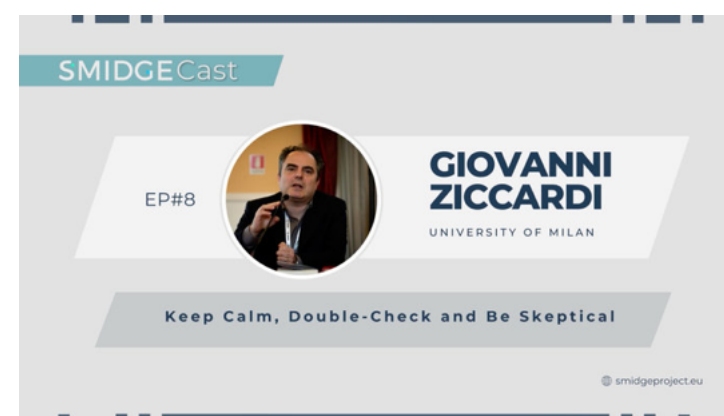
KCSS hosted two webinars: one focused on Gaming Platforms and Radicalisation and another addressing Disinformation, Radicalisation and Extremism.

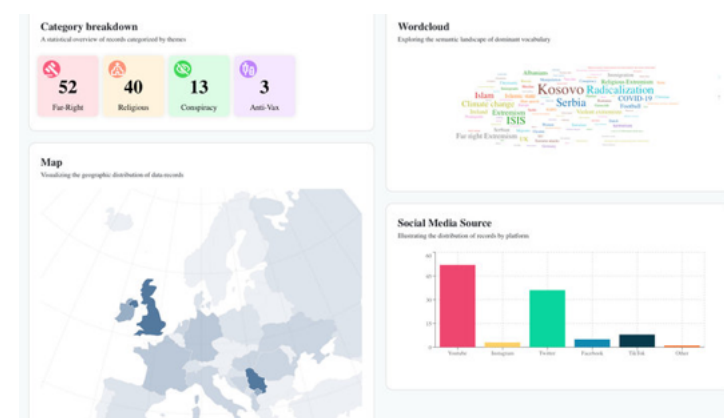
